- There has not been transparent consideration to moving elementary faith formation an hour before Mass. I attended the Faith Formation Committee meeting where it was to be discussed...It was last on the agenda, I had to leave and there was only 1 other elementary parent there anyway. - Corpus Christi Church has the very best of priests in the immediate area. Where is the red candle light that indicates that it is a Catholic Church? There is a lot of talking in the church prior to Mass instead of praying, which talking can be reserved for the gathering area. The stations of the cross and statues are really “blah” they certainly don’t get anyone’s attention.
- Fr. Marc now had an opportunity to meet Corpus Christi parish members. He is a very nice priest. I can understand him wanting to meet everyone, so the Saturday mass would have been problematic. Now that he is established, maybe he would be more comfortable with alternating between the parishes on Saturday. As Fr. Marc pointed out, 20% of members are seniors. The Saturday Mass was about 90% seniors. The Sunday morning Mass is very busy with families and they need room. Lately it is difficult to find seating because some of the seniors move from Saturday to Sunday. Sunday evening Mass usually accommodates those who can’t get to Mass elsewhere. Also, it is later, thus difficult for seniors with night-vision issues.
- Response to Fr. Marc Paveglio “The State of the Parish” homily: I am very excited and proud to hear about all the good things that are happening at Corpus Christi. I am also very thankful that C.C. was able to not only get a priest to replace Fr. Fitz and keep C.C. going and vibrant. But that we were blessed to get such a dynamic one as Fr. Paveglio. Thus, my first concern is that both parishes, St. Rose and Corpus Christi, do not take advantage and burn out this great, young priest. I would recommend that both parishes look at sharing and/or hire their own Parish life Director/Parish Administrator to take on the day to day management of the parishes and school and let Fr. Paveglio put his time into the spiritual lives of the parish. This suggestion was recommended by Deacon Riordan during the transition time of Fr. Fitz’s retirement and one that I know C.C. Parish Council has discussed. I think it is time for both parishes to have serious discussions about it.
- I was speaking with Sandy and Fr. Paveglio after mass Sunday and they told me to send them my idea. The idea needs to be researched more. I was

thinking about the homeless college students and what some of them are doing. See google search on CBS Sunday Morning Show Homeless college students for some further information. The point of those articles got me thinking about keeping our property safe without a huge outlay of church time and talent. It seems with the right set up and oversight that the shelter for the students is a great idea because (other homeless folks are much more dangerous to our property and resources) these kids want to succeed, are working to get ahead and are smart. They can run the program in part of us. Also, with some buy in from local farmers market, food shelves, church food donations these kids can feed/prepare the food in the communal kitchen. It would not take a lot to retrofit the space as it was a convent space in the past. I also do feel passionate about helping young folks and I see this as a win win for all. I know there is a lot more to this idea that needs to be thought out and considered. I would be willing to be part of that process if you believe this to be a worthy suggestion.

- Corpus Christi had had a history of good religious education programs. These programs are well managed, involve parish volunteers, and are appropriate for the age groups. However, their strongest point is the way they transition children/youth activities into parish life as a whole. Examples: small children contributing to the collection and bringing up the gifts-Epiphany program presented for the parish-joint work with adults in preparing Easter baskets-sometimes 2 or 3 generations working together at Fish Fries-give and grin-stockings, wreathes made by young people for the mission trip fundraiser-parents night out-Wednesday Evening worship. Leisure Center (senior group meets each Wednesday-opportunity for socialization, crafts, exercise, free blood pressure, both educational and entertainment programs, and a good hot noon meal) Corpus Christi parishioners attend each week-Corpus Christi members organize 3 to 4 events for the group each year. Just a couple of positive points about the parish.
- I fully support the infrastructure improvements-fix the leaky roof, renovate the school wing, and repair the parking lot. However, the thought of a marquee-style sign is sickening to me. I don't want my church to be advertises like a Walmart. We have a beautiful church with beautiful signs already. That money can be better spent elsewhere.
